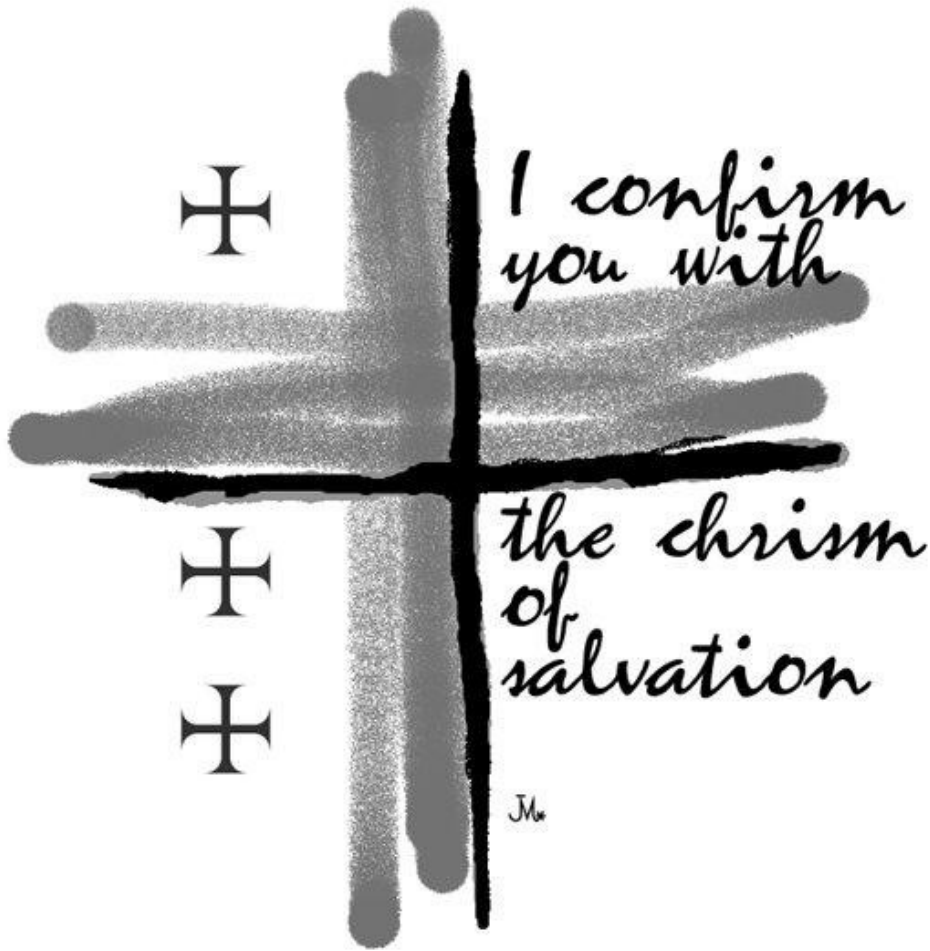

We have a job for YOU! (Parents, grandparents, older siblings, etc.) We need many volunteers to make this preparation happen. Please prayerfully consider helping.

Please Note:

Because of the nature of our process, we are seeking people who will commit to being here for **EVERY** meeting.

Mentor Job Description ~ We must have at least 7-8 Mentors (depending upon # of candidates). Each small faith group must have at least one mentor, an adult, who stays with the group, gets to know everyone in the group, helps them through the process, keeps track of their progress, etc. This person is not the catechist, but he or she will assist the different catechists each week with the group. Mentors will also help at the retreat, lead the last meeting, help at the rehearsal, and may participate in the Confirmation liturgy.

Catechist Job Description ~ We must have at least 7-8 catechists (depending upon # of candidates). Each catechist will be responsible for preparing and presenting one of the rotation sessions above each week to a different small faith group for those 7-8 weeks. Catechists are strongly encouraged to recruit a partner to help them with their preparation and presentation. This will help in case one of them should get sick and have to miss a week. Catechists will also help lead the retreat, help at the last meeting and the rehearsal, and may participate in the Confirmation liturgy.

5 Confirmation Questions & Answers

What Is Confirmation?

Confirmation is one of the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church and, more specifically, one of the three sacraments of initiation into the Church. Those who have been baptized in the living waters of Christ continue on their journey of faith with the nurture and support of the community of believers through Eucharist and Confirmation. In Confirmation we celebrate the continuing grace-giving presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Jesus continually extends an invitation to us to join in a fuller and closer relationship with Him and with our faith community.

What Does Confirmation Do?

Through the Sacrament of Confirmation, those who have been born anew in Christ through the living waters of baptism are bound more intimately to the community of believers, the Church. Confirmation joins believers more perfectly with Christ, and strengthens them with grace so that they may bear witness to Christ as His disciples.

Does My Confirmation Mean That I Am An Adult?

Well... The sacrament of confirmation calls the one confirmed to greater maturity. Growth toward Christian maturity is a life-long journey and the Holy Spirit travels with us, strengthening us as we go. In Confirmation, we are bound more intimately to the Church, and become more strictly obliged to live out the baptismal call to be priest, prophet, and king as a disciple of Christ.... So, even though you may not be an adult yet, this is a really BIG deal in the Church!

Does Confirmation Mark The End Of My Faith Formation?

No way!!! Confirmation does not make us perfect Christians nor does the completion of the candidate's preparation for this sacrament complete the formation necessary for continued growth as a maturing Christian. The faith formation we experience when we are young is simply preparation for the ongoing faith formation we need as an adult in order to answer God's call to live as affective Christian witnesses in the world. Closely connected to Baptism and Confirmation is that other sacrament of initiation, Eucharist. **Through regular participation in the Eucharist** we are nourished for our continuing study and growth in the life of the Church, and in turn, we nourish and strengthen our sisters and brothers in our faith community so that they may grow in faith. Hey! That brings to mind that other BIG question: *Am I really supposed to go to Church?* Fair question, but you *really know* the answer is YES. We'll talk more about this during the preparation process.

At our parish you can continue your faith formation with our weekly REALITY, and with our fall, spring, and Kairos retreats. See the website for more information.



What Is Anointing All About?

This part is really awesome! Christ was priest, prophet, and king. Anointing is historically and traditionally a sign of initiation into these servant roles. Being anointed with Holy Chrism on the forehead is a powerful sign of our unity with Christ as priests, prophets, and kings. Chrism is a mixture of olive oil and balsam that is blessed by the bishop during Holy Week. It smells great! (Well, *we* think so anyway!)

Who Confirms?

The bishop is the ordinary minister of Confirmation, just as he was the ordinary minister of Baptism until the two sacraments were separated. (In the early church the three sacraments of initiation were all celebrated together within the same liturgy.) The bishop kept the role as ordinary minister of Confirmation to emphasize unity with the Church beyond the parish. In the Archdiocese of Cincinnati it is impossible for the Archbishop to confirm everyone, so he may delegate this responsibility to others (e.g., Auxiliary Bishops, priests by special permission, and local deans who represent the bishop in regions called "deaneries"). This preserves and upholds the concept that Church is more than a parish.

What Is A Candidate And A Sponsor?

The Candidate is the person discerning about, or preparing for, Confirmation. The Sponsor is the person chosen by the candidate as a representative of the Catholic Church community to support the candidate on her/his journey.

Choosing Your Sponsor

Each candidate must choose a sponsor who will help him or her prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation. You need the support and presence of your sponsor. When choosing a sponsor, keep in mind that the sponsor must take an active part in the process. Please carefully read the following descriptions of the requirements, role, and participation of the sponsor.

Fill out the information about your sponsor on page 22.

Requirements for Your Sponsor...

- **Should be at least 16 years old** (*See me if this is a problem.*)
- **Must be a Confirmed Catholic**
- **Must have already received the sacrament of Eucharist**
- **Must lead a life in harmony with the faith and the role of sponsor (good Christian, practicing Catholic)**
- **May NOT be the parent of the candidate!**
(other relatives okay)

* **Does not** have to be the same sex as the candidate.

* **Does not** have to be the Baptismal sponsor, although this is encouraged by the Church to emphasize the close connection between Baptism and Confirmation.

The Role of the Sponsor is...

- To journey with the Confirmation candidate through the discernment and preparation process
- To present the candidate to the bishop for anointing
- To support the newly Confirmed young adult as she/he continues on their faith journey

Participation with Your Sponsor...

- ~Meets with you 2 times on your own
- ~Assists with the service experiences if possible
- ~Participates in **rehearsal**
- ~Participates in the Confirmation celebration liturgy

What If My Sponsor Can't be at Rehearsal/Confirmation?

If your sponsor can't be at rehearsal, your parent or someone else must stand in for your sponsor that morning. Then, you and the "stand-in" must explain everything to your sponsor. If your sponsor can't be at the Confirmation Mass, someone can stand in for him/her (including parents), but your original sponsor will still be listed as your official sponsor on your certificate and in our records at church.

Our Confirmation Process!

Why High School Preparation?

High School preparation for Confirmation is a long-time tradition here. We prepare during the high school years because we believe that young people in grades 9-12 are better able to understand the process, to participate more fully in the process, and to make an informed choice about receiving the sacrament than are younger teens and children.



Registration

Registration form... Attached to this booklet. We must have all the information!

Baptismal Certificate... If the candidate was not baptized at St. John's, or if they did not receive First Eucharist here, we **must** have a copy of the baptismal certificate. If you don't have the certificate, please get us a copy by **Feb. 1**. The church where they were baptized can mail or fax the information to St. John. (Fax to 513-777-9741.)

Recordkeeping... We have to record sacraments in special books (the old-fashioned way), and send a letter to the parish of baptism for their records, so we need the address of the parish of baptism. Lots of paperwork, but it's required.

Medical release form... We will keep the form on file until *next* September. You only have to fill it out once, and it covers all youth ministry activities until then.

Fee... It covers materials and supplies. If this fee is a hardship for you, please call the youth office and let Debbie know. No one will be denied the opportunity to participate in any aspect of our youth ministry because of their inability to pay.

Which Small Faith Group Am I In?

*Please note that you can give us **two names of people** you'd like to be with in a small group during preparation. We will make sure that you're with at least **one** of these people.

However, if you don't give us these names, we will just guess our best, and you'll stay in the group in which we put you. If you register late, the groups may be full, and you might not get your choice of group.

Discernment & Preparation

This is a process of discernment and preparation because during this time the Candidates are encouraged to consider everything they've learned, and are still learning about themselves and their faith. Then, they decide for themselves if they want to be confirmed at this time. **It is the parents' responsibility to make sure that their child receives faith formation and preparation for sacraments. However, it is the Candidate's decision to be confirmed or not confirmed.** When the preparation process is nearing completion, each Candidate will have an opportunity to give us their decision.

Confirmation Enrollment Ritual

At a Sunday mass, we will call forward all the Confirmation Candidates for a special blessing as they begin their discernment and preparation. This lets the parish have the opportunity to witness the beginning of the process, and to pray for the Candidates.

The Retreat

We give a mini-retreat for all Candidates at St. John Hall. This is an opportunity for them to bond with their small group and the other young people in preparation. They also get acquainted with the adults on the team. The retreat includes elements of formation and fun. We will serve pizza at the beginning of the retreat. **All Candidates should participate in the retreat.** Let us know about food allergies!

Small Faith Group Meetings

Meetings will take place on Sunday evenings. Please check the schedule for the exact dates and times. We will start in Favret Hall, and then move to our designated small group meeting spaces located in the Parish Office Building and the Pavilion.

The Process.....How it Flows:

~The Entrance Ritual

~The Retreat

~Meetings #1-7 ~ A different topic each week

- Sin, Reconciliation, & Forgiveness

Groups & their mentors rotate through different topics each week with different catechists.

~Holy Week ~ Candidates are encouraged to attend services on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, & Easter Vigil or Easter Sunday. They should invite their families, too!

~Interviews ~ between April 15-30.

~Confirmation Weekend ~ **All** Candidates and Sponsors **MUST** participate in the following:

Saturday, Rehearsal at 10 AM, takes just 1 hour!

Sunday, Confirmation Liturgy at 11:30 AM Mass (be there by 11 AM in Chapel).

Lenten Mission & Generations of Faith

This is our whole parish, multi-generational faith formation! Candidates & their families are invited to participate on:

- March 3-6... 7-8:30 PM, Church (Lenten Mission)
 - March 20 or March 21 ... 6-8:15 PM, Center (Generations)
- Pre-register online in January at www.stjohnwc.org.

Interviews

Candidates get the chance to express their desire and readiness - or in some cases, their unwillingness - to be Confirmed at their interview. We also make sure we have all necessary information from the Candidate, and that they have been adequately prepared. The Candidates get a chance to critique the process, and ask any "burning" questions they might still have. These will take place April 15-30.

THE Most-Asked Question:

What to Wear...Or What NOT to Wear!

The Confirmation celebration is a VERY SPECIAL occasion. Please wear something really nice to church that day. Girls: NO bare tummies, NO spaghetti straps, NO strapless dresses, NO short skirts, and NO see-through anything! Boys: NO pants falling off your waist, please, and NO shorts! If you're not sure about what not to wear, just ask your mentor or call the Youth Office at 755-4972.

PLEASE REMEMBER!!!

- The registration deadline is **January 15**.
- Don't forget to give us **2** names for making groups!
- You should start on your **service** ASAP!
- Get blessed on **January 15** at the entrance Ritual at 11:30 AM Mass!

Choosing Your Confirmation Name

Long ago, when Baptism and Confirmation were celebrated together, a new name was chosen to indicate that this person was no longer the same person he/she was before, but had assumed a new Christian lifestyle. Except for the RCIA process (Rite of Christian Initiation where we bring people into the Catholic Church) we no longer celebrate Baptism and Confirmation together. Instead, we celebrate Confirmation as a continuation and finalization of the initiation process.

In order to show unity in the initiation process, the Church encourages us to use our baptismal name for Confirmation. However, you may choose to use a "Confirmation Name" instead. This name should be:

- A Christian name that holds special meaning for you
- The name of a saint or a good Christian role model

You may also use your middle name, or you may choose another name to add to your first and middle name. The bishop, or his representative, will speak your name as he anoints your head with the Holy Chrism at the Confirmation Mass. Research your baptismal name and your other name choices in books about Saints and online at:

www.catholic.org/saints.

Fill in your choice for Confirmation Name on page 22, and turn it in to the office by April 15.

Being a Christian, a Catholic, and a disciple of Christ calls us to live our lives according to the example and instructions Jesus himself gave us. This is our mission as Church, and it's a BIG responsibility! One of the most important lessons Jesus taught us was that we must be willing to be a servant to all people in His name. This means that we must actually DO something to be a disciple of Christ! By doing parish and community service, we demonstrate a willingness to show Christian responsibility to our mission.

At St. John's, we want all Candidates to have 2 "experiences of service". This means that the Candidates should participate in some type of parish or community service twice, or in 2 different services. We **do not** require a specific number of hours.

An "experience of service" might be helping at Share-A-Lunch or a nursing home one time. (Please see the next page for more examples and details.) If the Candidate is already serving as an Altar Attendant, Eucharistic Minister, or in some other position frequently, they only need to do **ONE** other experience of service.



Often during their service experiences, Candidates realize that they are already doing Jesus' work. However, some Candidates find that they are missing opportunities to answer Jesus' call to serve. Parents, sponsors, mentors, catechists, and other candidates can then encourage and inspire them to continue finding ways to actively do Jesus' work through parish and community service after they are confirmed.

Please see the following page for examples of service. Please discuss your choices with your parents and mentor.

Service should be something that truly gives you an experience of discipleship! GOOD examples of service:

In this first session, you will be sharing some of your ideas and beliefs. Please jot down *a few words* about what you discussed for each question. We're *not* looking for a lot of writing here - just show that you did discuss these questions with your sponsor!

Getting Started

If you don't know each other very well, you could start with these questions: Where do you/did you go to school? Do you have any hobbies? What do you like to do in your spare time?

Questions for Discussion

Sponsor: What are your memories of the Church when you were growing up? Has it changed? How?

Sponsor: How were you active in Church during high school? Did your church have a youth group or youth ministry? Were there religious education classes? What were they like? How are you active in your parish now?

Candidate: How are you active in the parish? In what youth activities or retreats have you participated? How have you participated in religious education in the past? When? If you answered "no" to these questions, explain why.

Both: What makes you feel like you belong in your parish?



Both: What do you remember about the celebrations of the sacraments in which you have taken part?

Sponsor: Talk about your Confirmation. How old were you? What did it mean to you? What was the preparation like? Did you have a choice about whether or not to be confirmed?

Candidate: Why do you want to be confirmed? Was it your decision to begin preparation for the sacrament?

Both: What makes someone a "good Christian"? Do you fit the label?

Both: Do you ever have doubts about your faith? Give an example. Do you have questions about your faith? What are they? Do you enjoy living your faith, or is practicing your faith a burden?

Read Mark 12:28-31.....One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

What does this passage say to both of you? Can you apply it to your daily life? How?

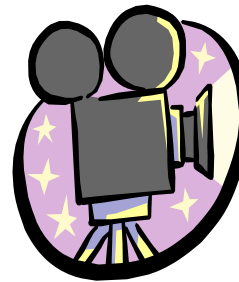

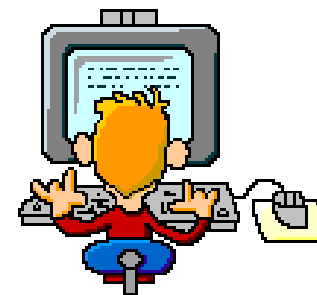
